Discuss the first two sentences of the prayer with your child and explain how when we act responsibly we are firm in the Covenant and obey God's laws. Make the "Light of Divine Guidance" shine by using colors to represent light, and then paste the prayer on the back.

O Lord my God! Assist Thy loved ones to be firm in Thy Faith, to walk in Thy ways, to be steadfast in Thy Cause. Give them Thy grace to withstand the onslaught of self and passion, to follow the light of divine guidance. Thou art the Powerful, the Gracious, the Self-Subsisting, the Bestower, the Compassionate, the Almighty, the All-Bountiful. ('Abdu'l-Bahá, Baha'i Prayers, p. 165)



A pledge is a "solemn promise." Sometimes when people make a pledge they hold up their hand or put their hand over their heart. A preserver is someone who "maintains" or "protects" something.

Trace your child's hand and paste the words PLEDGE on it. Then create some sort of fortress around the hand, such as a house or box, to protect it.

Paste the quotation on the back of the project.
